
Dear Mr. Weinstein:

I write to you in your capacity as chairperson of the American Polygraph Association (APA)'s Ethics & Grievance Committee to bring to your attention misconduct by Dr. Louis Irving Rovner, Ph.D. of Woodland Hills, California, a member of your organization. Dr. Rovner made false and defamatory statements about me during the course of a polygraph examination that he videorecorded for evidentiary purposes on 9 March 2007 and that was played in open court in the case of *Ohio v. Sharma*. Specifically, Dr. Rovner 1) deliberately conveyed the false notion to his examinee that I am a fugitive from justice who fled the United States to avoid criminal prosecution, and 2) falsely claimed that I sent him a computer virus (a federal crime).
