MSG Simpson discussed your concerns below with me, and after consulting with the DIA Office of Security, we see no apparent violation of policy. SEC maintains that you were aware of the investigation into the concerns regarding your inability to complete the CSP, and based on the paragraphs you cited below, the Agency appears to be in compliance with the applicable DoD regulation.

We recommend that you continue to work with your management chain, to include contacting senior SEC management regarding your concerns and/or other senior DIA management officials. Also, as reflected in the email you provided, you can appeal this decision to the head of the DoD component, being the Director, DIA, or whatever Agency that made the decision to suspend your access.
